

LA JOLLA PLAYHOUSE ANNOUNCES EXTENSION FOR WORLD-PREMIERE MUSICAL *DIANA*

La Jolla, CA – ...Due to popular demand, La Jolla Playhouse announces a **week-long extension** for its upcoming world premiere musical *Diana*, featuring the Tony Award-winning *Memphis* creative team of **Joe DiPietro** (librettist/lyricist), **David Bryan** (composer/lyricist) and Playhouse Artistic Director and 2017 Tony recipient **Christopher Ashley** (director), along with Tony Award nominee **Kelly Devine** (choreographer) and **Ian Eisendrath** (music supervisor).

Diana will now run **February 19 – April 7, 2019** in the Playhouse's Mandell Weiss Theatre. Tickets for the extension week go on sale today for subscribers and on December 6 for the general public at <u>LaJollaPlayhouse.org</u> or (858) 550-1010.

About Diana

In 1981, an assistant kindergarten teacher married the Prince of Wales and, overnight, became the most famous woman in the world. But behind the fairytale, there was a troubled marriage and a young woman struggling to find her voice. Facing an entrenched monarchy and unprecedented media scrutiny, Princess Diana surprises everyone – including herself – as she grows into a global phenomenon and manages to change the world. Playhouse Artistic Director Christopher Ashley and the writers behind the Tony Award-winning musical *Memphis* create this highly anticipated musical, featuring an epic and sweeping contemporary score.

About the Creative Team

Joe DiPietro is a Tony Award-winning playwright and lyricist. He won two Tony Awards for cowriting *Memphis*, which also received the 2010 Tony, Drama Desk and Outer Critics Circle Awards for Best Musical. He was nominated for a Tony Award and won a Drama Desk Award for *Nice Work If You Can Get It* starring Matthew Broderick. His other plays and musicals include *I Love You, You're Perfect, Now Change* (the longest-running musical revue in Off-Broadway history), *The Toxic Avenger* and *The Thing About Men* (both winners of the Outer Critics Circle Award for Best Off-Broadway Musical), the much-produced comedy *Over the River and Through the Woods*, *The Art of Murder* (Edgar Award winner for Best Mystery Play) and the Broadway musical All *Shook Up.* In 2016, his play *Hollywood* had its world premiere at La Jolla Playhouse, and *Clever Little Lies*, starring Marlo Thomas, debuted at George Street Playhouse. His work has received thousands of productions across the country and around the world.

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David Bryan is a Tony Award-winning composer and lyricist. He won three 2010 Tony Awards for Best Score, Best Orchestrations and Best Musical for the hit Broadway musical *Memphis*, as well as the Drama Desk and Outer Critics Circle Awards for Best Musical. He is a Grammy® Awardwinning keyboard player and founding member of Bon Jovi. Over the past 30 years the band has sold more than 150 million records and toured the world, playing to millions of people. Their recent Because We Can tour was the #1 grossing tour in the world. He and Joe DiPietro have also co-written the award-winning musical *The Toxic Avenger*. Mr. Bryan is also a National Spokesperson for VH1's Save The Music Program. Christopher Ashley has served as La Jolla Playhouse's Artistic Director since October, 2007. During his tenure, he has helmed the Playhouse's productions of The Squirrels, Hollywood, The Darrell Hammond Project, Chasing the Song, His Girl Friday, Glengarry Glen Ross, A Dram of Drummhicit, A Midsummer Night's Dream, Restoration, as well as the musicals Escape to Margaritaville, Xanadu, Memphis, which won four 2010 Tony Awards including Best Musical, and Come From Away, for which he won the 2017 Tony Award for Best Director of a Musical. He also spearheaded the Playhouse's Without Walls (WOW) series, the DNA New Work Series and the Resident Theatre program. Prior to joining the Playhouse, he directed the Broadway productions of Xanadu (Drama Desk nomination), All Shook Up and The Rocky Horror Show (Tony, Drama Desk and Outer Critics Circle Award nominations), as well as the Kennedy Center Sondheim Celebration productions of Sweeney Todd and Merrily We Roll Along. Other New York credits include: Blown Sideways Through Life, Jeffrey (Lucille Lortel and Obie Awards), The Most Fabulous Story Ever Told, Valhalla, Regrets Only, Communicating Doors, Wonder of the World, Bunny Bunny, The Night Hank Williams Died and Fires in the Mirror (Lucille Lortel Award), among others. Mr. Ashley also directed the feature films Jeffrey and Lucky Stiff, as well as the American Playhouse production of Blown Sideways Through Life for PBS. Mr. Ashley is the recipient of the Princess Grace Award, the Drama League Director Fellowship and an NEA/TCG Director Fellowship.

Kelly Devine's Playhouse credits include Escape to Margaritaville, Come From Away, Peter and the Starcatcher, Zhivago and Private Fittings. Her Broadway credits include Come From Away (Tony Award nomination), Escape to Margaritaville, Doctor Zhivago, Rocky (Tony, Drama Desk and Outer Critics Award nominations) and Rock of Ages. International: Rocky (Germany), Rock of Ages (West End, UK tour, Toronto, Australia; Helpmann & Green Room Awards). Opera: Faust (The Met & ENO), Wozzeck (San Diego Opera). Off-Broadway: Rock of Ages, Fat Camp, Frankenstein, Anne Wrecksick. Regional: Come From Away, Toxic Avenger, A Christmas Story, Bloody Bloody Andrew Jackson.
