ABOUT THE POSITION

The Draftsperson plays a crucial role in the production process by translating scenic design concepts into detailed technical drawings. They work under the direction of the Scenery Supervisors and closely with the Scenic Designer to create accurate and comprehensive drafting plans that guide the construction of scenic elements for La Jolla Playhouse productions. Using identified materials and methods of construction, the Draftsperson creates 3D AutoCAD models and drawings for all scenic elements.

ESSENTIAL JOB DUTIES

- Create and maintain professional quality theatrical construction working drawings in AutoCAD for all scenic elements based on the designer drawings so they can be built by the shop staff or by over hire labor.
- Collaborate with the Scenic Designer, Scenery Supervisors and Paint Charge to understand the vision and requirements for all scenic elements.
- Prepare detailed ground plans and sections of designer drawings, rigging and technical drawings in AutoCAD and PDF formats for use by technical, production, stage management and design staff.
- Ensure that drafting plans accurately represent the intended aesthetic and functionality of scenic elements, with emphasis on structural integrity, safety, and practical considerations.
- Answer questions and clarify drawings as appropriate or necessary.
- Function in a professional and collegial manner when collaborating with all theatre personnel, professional creative teams, staff, management, and visiting artists.
- Draw and program files for ShopBot CNC Router and CNC Plasma Cutter.
- Adhere to deadlines and production schedules, managing workload efficiently to meet project milestones and delivery dates.
- Perform other duties as assigned in collaboration with theatre personnel, professional creative teams, staff, management, and other visiting artists.
