Bring Back the Happening

Dutch theater collective Nineties

Bring Back The Happening is neither a play nor a show. It is an interactive, high-spirited way to connect with others and find healing. Nineties calls in the happening as an oath to, and memorial for togetherness and makes all worldly dislocation momentarily forgotten. They make contemporary theater, playing with visual art, digital media, literature, music and performance. The work is neither formless, nor fixed in form. Breaking with conventions and elevating transitions to tradition. Surrender to a lively ritual underscored by a lush soundtrack (and maybe a few dinosaurs)

Seeking:

A female or nonbinary identifying performer with a love for movement; no real dance skills are needed but part of the role is to teach the audience a simple dance routine. Looking for someone who is familiar with bringing their self and a personal story energetically to the stage. Script memorization and some improvisation will be required.

How to Put On a Sock is an interactive sex ed tour of the United States that highlights the highs, lows, and in-betweens of what teens are (and are not) taught about sex today – and what we all still need to learn. The project is performed by a diverse multigenerational cast, made up primarily of local residents for each production.

Seeking:

3 performers who will play themselves. Must be comfortable with audience interaction and direct engagement. They should also be interested in a new play development process, and one that focuses – respectfully – on content around sex and sexuality. Part of the process will be working with the writer-director to craft a personal story about a sex ed experience to deliver to the audience during the show (only something they are comfortable sharing, of course!); performers with writing experience or who are interested in that aspect are encouraged.

Especially looking for a late teens/early 20s performer and a 50s+ performer.

Rehearsals will happen online during the month of April, possibly with a short online development workshop for a few days in March as well. Exact schedule to be set (and can be around company's availability) but likely 3-4 hours/day for 5-6 days/week from April 1-20.
