La Jolla, CA – La Jolla Playhouse announces full programming for the <u>2025 WOW Festival</u> of immersive and site-inspired work, presented in partnership with **UC San Diego**. The WOW Festival will take place **April 24 – 27** on the UC San Diego campus.

Like previous WOW Festivals, the 2025 event will feature four action-packed days of theatre, dance, music, puppetry, spectacle events, and more, with multiple performances by acclaimed local, national and international artists occurring throughout the weekend.

Admission to the WOW Festival is free, and the majority of WOW productions are free of charge, with a handful of ticketed performances ranging from \$12 to \$37. Please visit <u>wowfestival.org</u> for the full WOW Festival schedule, information and tickets.

Additionally, the Playhouse will present performances of the 2025 Performance Outreach Program (POP) Tour, *The Weather Busters of Beachcastle*, during the WOW Festival. Other special WOW Festival projects include *Shifting Horizons*, created by the **San Diego Unified School District Honors Theatre Project** and *Goldilocks Screentime*, created by **UC Theatre and Dance** students.

Without Walls (WOW) is La Jolla Playhouse's signature performance program that takes art outside traditional theatre walls and into unique spaces, including the annual WOW Festival and WOW standalone productions. From a car to a bar, from a beach to a basement, WOW invites audiences of all ages to interact with artists and art in unexpected ways, bringing people together and reimagining what storytelling can be. WOW has become one of the region's most popular and acclaimed performance programs. Since its inception in 2011, the Playhouse has commissioned and presented a series of immersive, site-inspired and virtual productions throughout the San Diego community, including eight stand-alone productions, seven WOW Festivals and fourteen Digital WOW pieces.

As if viewing paintings in a gallery, you choose the order and duration of your viewing experience with each film—you may even have the chance to interact with the writers and artists behind the works.

Burnout Paradise (Tickets: \$37)

Four performers mount their treadmills, and the challenge begins. *Burnout Paradise* tests the limits of mind, body, and spirit in an increasingly frenetic juggling act of absurdity. A delusional love letter to the reckless labor and euphoric optimism before burnout, demonstrating that the system isn't designed for us: it's designed to break us. Time Out called it "one of the most frenetically uproarious shows of gloriously demented ecstasy."

when my body talks is an experience exploring our first-time queer experiences – how they resonate in our bodies and shape our identities. Inspired by the question, "Why do we keep having 'first-time' experiences as queer people?", the piece deconstructs moments of discovery, secrecy, celebration, and love through movement, monologue, and music. Developed at Diversionary Theatre, when my body talks fosters a shared exploration of storytelling to reimagine the past and create a better future.

The Weather Busters of Beachcastle (Free)

La Jolla Playhouse POP Tour San Diego, CA

Bizarre weather is wreaking havoc in Beachcastle, California, and the only ones who can save the town are 12-year-olds Jayce and Kori. When they meet a mysterious explorer from beyond the stars, they embark on a journey that will change their lives--and their community--forever. *The Weather Busters of Beachcastle* is a world-premiere play for young audiences and families exploring how we all can make a difference.

WOW Festival Artist Biographies

Memo Akten (*Green Memories*) is an artist, researcher and philomath from Istanbul, Turkey. He works with emerging technologies and computation as a medium to create moving images, compositions, large-scale responsive installations and performances. He brings together fields such as biological and artificial intelligence, computational creativity, perception, consciousness, information theory, neuroscience, fundamental physics, cosmology, spirituality, ritual and religion. Akten combines critical and conceptual approaches, with investigations into form, movement and sound. He uses code as his craft to design behavioral abstractions and data dramatizations of natural and anthropogenic processes. He holds a Ph.D. from Goldsmiths, University of London, specializing in expressive human-machine interaction and artistic explorations of Artificial Intelligence (AI).

San Diego-based artists Bridget Rountree and Iain Gunn are <u>Animal Cracker Conspiracy</u> (*ODDISEA: A Puppet Procession*), a contemporary hybrid puppet company invested in pushing the boundaries of kinetic performance. Joining forces in 2004, their ongoing practice is based on a shared interest and exploration of where fine art, puppetry, performance art, physical theatre, film and mixed media intersect. They actively cultivate the suspension of disbelief by embracing the unknown and using the manipulation of puppets to create original stories. Past work includes: 2022 WOW Festival's *Transmythical*; Digital WOW's *The Society of Wonder, Adrift, Myth Project 1, Paper Cities Project, The Collector, Desire to Fly* and many others.

Esty Bharier and **Molly Maslak** (*Bev and Blanche's Care-a-Van*) Esty is a writer, puppeteer, and creative consultant for themed entertainment and immersive theater. Her experience ranges from intimate immersive shows to large-scale theme parks. Molly is a puppeteer, actor, writer, and arts educator. She studied theatre at the University of San Diego and is an alumni of the Meisner/ Chekhov Integrated Actor Training Studio. Esty and Molly are recent alumni of the National Puppetry Conference at the Eugene O'Neill Theater Center. Their work uses puppetry, vulnerability, and humor to connect with people and explore difficult topics while spreading positive messages of compassion and mental health awareness.

Blindspot Collective (*Tale Travelers*) develops transformative theatre that amplifies marginalized voices, illuminates untold stories, bridges disparate experiences, and energizes vulnerable communities. The company has received acclaim for its original work, including site-specific events, new musicals, forum theatre, and verbatim plays that have been nominated or awarded Outstanding Solo Performance, Outstanding Musical, and Outstanding New Company by the San Diego Theatre Critics Circle. Previous collaborations with La Jolla Playhouse include *iykyk*, *salty water*, *Black Séance*, *Hall Pass* and *Walks of Life*. Since its founding in 2017, Blindspot Collective has collaborated with The Old Globe; Diversionary Theatre; UC San Diego; and other community partners to develop projects that meaningfully engage audiences and artists in the blindspot of society.

Bo Koek, Rik Elstgeest, John van Oostrum and Chris Doyle are **Touki Delphine** (*FIREBIRD*) an artist collective of musicians, performers and visual artists from Amsterdam, The Netherlands. The members draw from their eclectic backgrounds to create stimulating visual art and modern music performances. In their multidimensional works, they pull from classic and modern music from all corners of the globe, and combine reinterpretations with original compositions and new visual concepts crossing and blurring disciplinary boundaries. Their work is inspired by the climate crisis and the insights of natural science that nature is a living whole, not a dysfunctional mass. Using recycled materials, Touki Delphine creates installations that explore a restoration of balance between nature, technology and humans. Our collective discarded technology is salvaged and given a new life in their performances. Although abstract, they inevitably portray nature, capturing its inspiring beauty and power, offering a stimulating and contemplative experience for the human audience.

Diversionary Theatre's (*when my body talks*) mission is to provide an inspiring, inclusive, and empowering space for community to celebrate and explore complex, provocative, and diverse LGBTQIA+ stories which contribute to the larger cultural discussion. Since its founding in 1986, we have continually provided an inspiring and thought-provoking theatrical platform to explore complex and diverse stories of the lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer and questioning communities in the form of live entertainment that can be enjoyed by all.

FLIP Fabrique (*Summer Break*) is a circus company based in Québec, Canada. Born out of the dreams and the friendship of circus performers in 2011, this troupe is renowned around the world for its beloved productions combining astonishing feats and true visual poetry. Composed of world-class artists, the troupe crafts contemporary circus shows with an uncanny ability to have fun and move the audience. In addition to its large-scale shows presented every summer in Québec City since 2015, the troupe is performing around the globe in the most prestigious circus institutions and festivals.

Robert Farid Karimi (*American Dream Casino*), critically-acclaimed trans-channel artist, interactive experience educator, performer, author and cultural activist, designs interactive immersive game-performance experiences to spark players to imagine worlds of mutual community nourishment. Karimi is an artist of Iranian/Guatemalan/Mayan descent, whose work frequently addresses themes of cultural heritage, social justice, and community engagement, bridging various artistic mediums to foster dialogue and human connection. With over 25 years of expertise, Karimi develops playful participatory platforms that foster dialogue and human connection to spaces worldwide — from General Mills to Off Broadway to Nuyorican Poets Café to NPR to HBO's Def Poetry Jam, Hawaii International Film Festival, The Smithsonian, and South by Southwest. Karimi is co-director of the Public Practice + Generative Play StudioLab and serves as Assistant Professor in the Music, Dance and Theater department at Arizona State University.



Rachel Gita Karp (How to Put On a Sock) makes performances to change US politics and policy. Based in NY, Rachel has written and directed performances through The Drama League, Clubbed Thumb, Ars Nova, Mabou Mines, Irondale, Brooklyn Arts Council, NY Foundation for the Arts, LaGuardia Performing Arts Center, The Wild Project, The Brick, The Flea, Dixon Place, Incubator Arts Project, Network of Ensemble Theaters. Regional credits include Actors Theatre of Louisville, Pennsylvania Center for Women and Politics, Philly Fringe; residencies include SPACE on Ryder Farm, Barn Arts, Monson Arts, Orchard Project, Marble House Project, Kimmel Harding Nelson Center for the Arts, Tofte Lake Center.

Marcel Lucont (Les Enfantes Terribles – A Gameshow for Awful Children and Marcel Lucont's Whine List) has been staging critically-acclaimed shows around the world for over 15 years, picking up several accolades, including the Fringe World Award for Best Comedy Show. He has appeared on Comedy Central at the Comedy Store, Set List (Sky Atlantic) and Live at the Electric (BBC). Known for his deadpan wit, wry observations and bawdy poetry, he has been a hit at festivals such as Edinburgh Fringe, Melbourne Comedy Festival, Glastonbury Festival and New Zealand Comedy Festival.

<u>Nineties</u> (*Bring Back the Happening*) is a cutting-edge Dutch theater collective driven by their relentless experimentation and fearless curiosity and known for their radical fluidity. As creative shapeshifters, they playfully craft innovative narratives that embrace diverse worldviews, reflecting a generation shaped by multiple truths co-existing. Through thought-provoking storytelling, they challenge perceptions and make the present feel less elusive. With curiosity, commitment, and a touch of self-deprecation, they reimagine how stories are told—opening new perspectives that can help shape our future.

Playwrights Project (*Artists Everywhere*) is a San Diego based non-profit organization known statewide for its arts education programs. Our mission is to empower people of all ages and backgrounds to voice stories through theatre, inspiring individual growth and creating meaningful community connections. Playwrights Project's programs include in-school playwriting workshops for grades 3-12; an annual statewide playwriting competition for writers under age 19; professional productions of young writers' work; teacher training; and playwriting programs for adults, including those involved in the justice system, individuals recovering from substance abuse, current and former foster youth, veterans, and seniors.

Pony Cam (*Burnout Paradise*) is an award-winning experimental theatre collective of five theatre makers from across Australia. Driven by a desire to create experiences that defy expectations, they subvert familiar forms, activate unconventional spaces, and engage audiences in unexpected ways. With over five years of shared training, their practice is instinctive, physical and highly playful. Each work is unique, but all are united by a commitment to reimagine our impact on the world, celebrate community, and find joy—even in the face of tragedy. Pony Cam has recently performed in Edinburgh and New York, bringing their bold vision to international stages.



San Diego Circus Center (*Layers*) is committed to advancing circus training and enriching lives through contemporary and traditional disciplines. With a focus on higher education and professional programs, their inclusive, noncompetitive environment fosters personal growth emphasizing individual strengths. They also champion the joy of recreational studies, creating a vibrant community where circus arts inspire and unite everyone alike.
